

CLUE 1. One diagonal spells IOU (in some direction).


CLUE 2. One row spells TOO backwards.


- **CLUE** 3. Both Ts have a vowel in the square above them and in the square to their left.

#### **Good Influences on Performance**


- A clear understanding of the character's prehistory
- A clear understanding of the story
- A well chosen objective and intention
- Real listening
- Investing in the "need" of the moment and not anticipating the future
- Being open to whatever happens next
- Being relaxed
- Trusting in yourself

#### **Bad Influences on Performance**

- Just focusing on telling the story
- Believing that a particular scene is a great vehicle for your acting
- Striving to be good
- Striving to exploit emotion
- Failing to listen because it is already known what will be said next
- Listening for cues not meaning
- Acting (instead of inter-acting)


